Thank you for your membership, we couldn't do what we do without your support.



If you've ever directed a show, you know there is a lot of stress involved even on a good day. An introvert by nature, I can't help but sometimes dread meeting new people, leaving the house after coming home from work at the end of the day. Even so, directing a production is what I intentionally set out to do after initially reading *The Viewing Room*, an introspective and heartfelt play about the complexity of family relationships, redemption, and reconciliation. I believed in its themes, and I also believed, that despite my introversion, I would be OK, the production would also be OK. Little did I know then, both this production and I would turn out to be more than just *OK*.

The talented actors of *The Viewing Room*, Rick Fisher, Fran Kelty, Ian Grant, Jonathan Blair, Heather McGaha, Amber Stull, McKenna Sangren, John Slate and Libby Mitchell (understudy) all went above and beyond, not only in building their own characters but also working together to carefully mold the Dumbrosky family unit. I also want to extend my congratulations to Rick Fisher and Libby Mitchell, winners of the CLOTA Robe for their dedication to this production. Rick's efforts were tremendous, especially during tech days and on his custom-made casket. Although Libby didn't need to perform, she was nonetheless present at tech days, most of the rehearsals and was super helpful working a stand-in for the cast.

Two-fold it was a successful production; ticket sales were great and all, but I also ended up seeing virtually the same faces at my auditions for the Reader's Theatre production 'Tis the Season to Believe: A Bigfoot Christmas Special!



WRITER / DIRECTOR INTERVIEW

1. Why did you write another play about Bigfoot?

A couple of years ago, I attended the local Christmas parade along with several friends. One of them, Ceira Hagen, brought her children and she introduced me to her son Tommy. Let's just say that he got a kick learning that I'd written a play about Bigfoot (*Close Encounters of the Hairy Kind*) and that I was planning on directing it on the CLOTA stage in the upcoming months. Although he wanted to be in it, there were no parts in it for kids of his age. Long story short, I promised him I would write a Bigfoot Christmas show one day and he could be in it. Looking back, I was caught up in the moment, Christmas, Bigfoot and someone with stars in his eyes looking up at me like I could do anything.

2. Will audiences need to watch Close Encounters of the Hairy Kind to understand 'Tis the Season to Believe: A Bigfoot Christmas Special?

Although 'Tis the Season to Believe: A Bigfoot Christmas Special features several of the zany characters from Close Encounters of the Hairy Kind, it isn't entirely necessary as I included the role of "Narrator" to bridge the gap between stories and give historical background on some of the more prominent characters. Even so, it is on YouTube (just Google it!).

- 3. What would you want audiences to take away from "Tis the Season to Believe: A Bigfoot Christmas Special?"
- I'd want audiences to take away that believing in yourself is the best form of self-care you can do.
- 4. What did you enjoy about writing "Tis the Season to Believe: A Bigfoot Christmas Special?

After writing *Close Encounters of the Hairy Kind*, my characters, in a sense, froze in time. I often wondered what became of them or what should become of them. I enjoyed letting my mind imagine the possibilities and write them down on paper.

5. What directing or other theater projects do you have genres,?

Perhaps a writer should spread their wings, touch on other topics or genres but I love Bigfoot and my world in the fictional town of Ridgeview. I plan to keep doing what brings me joy and if I can make people laugh along the way, wonderful!



Elections! It's that time of year again!

The CLOTA Board of Directors (BoD), as per the CLOTA Bylaws, oversee the welfare of the organization and perform all duties imposed on them collectively, or individually, by law, by the CLOTA Articles of Incorporation, or by the CLOTA Bylaws.

Each board member shall hold office for a 2-year term beginning at the first January Board of Director meeting of the year following their election to the Board and ending at the end of the 24th month. Board members shall be elected on a staggered basis so that no more than 5 non-appointed members are elected each year.


Also, per the CLOTA Bylaws all General Members, Life Members and Honorary Life members are each entitled to vote for members of the CLOTA Board of Directors.

A family membership consists of two (2) voting members, so those with this type of membership will receive two (2) ballots with one (1) stamped, self-addressed envelope for your convenience.

- 1. DO NOT write your name on the ballot.
- 2. Cast your votes by marking the box next to the listed candidate(s) on your ballot.
- 3. If you'd like to run for a seat on the Board of Directors, add your name next to "WRITE IN BALLOT" section of your ballot.
- 4. Mail your ballot(s) in the provided stamped and self-addressed envelope by November 30th, 2024.
- ** Ballots will be carefully processed by our Nominating Committee to ensure a blind tally. **

THE CLOTA SPOTLIGHT "Summer on Treasure Island"

An interview with Susie Hankins - by Monica Dwyer

1. This past summer, you spent it traveling as part of a theatre troupe with Missoula Children's Theatre (MCT). Can you describe what that entailed?

MCT sends out a number of teams throughout the USA, Canada, and overseas. Each team consists of 2 Tour Actor/Directors (TAD). The two of you travel and work together the whole tour, doing the same show week after week. The show that I toured on was Treasure Island! On Sunday, we'd arrive to the community that hired us. Monday, we'd hold a unique 2-hour audition and cast up to 64 kids! Right away, we have our first rehearsal on the same day. For the next few days, we TADs divide and conquer, directing different character groups in different rooms, 4 hours a day. By the end of the week, the kids have learned their blocking, memorized their lines (and given instructions to ad lib in case they forget them), learned their songs, and get to perform the whole musical in their costumes for their community. One great feature is that with an entirely different cast every week, no performance is ever the same, giving a beautiful and endearing touch to it. There is more to the job than just directing, though. My tour partner and I were responsible for writing cast letters, washing and sorting the costumes every week, preparing for rehearsals, calling ahead for details on the upcoming week's residency, building and tearing down the set, and driving the Little Red Truck all around.

2. Had you done this before?

No, this past summer was my first time doing it! I wish I had known about MCT sooner, as I would have applied when I was in college and recently graduated.

3. Will you be doing it again next summer?

Unless something throws a wrench in the gears, I most definitely plan to go on tour with them. MCT doesn't only function during the summer, they also do a winter/spring and a fall tour. They have options on what tours you'd like to apply for.

4. October marks a year since you became a CLOTA member. What have been some of the highlights?

I have greatly enjoyed the opportunities to perform onstage as well as work backstage. Theatre is my biggest passion, and it makes me happy to meet so many others who share it. I also love how it gives me the opportunity to try something new and grow as a performer.

5. What are you currently doing with CLOTA?

Right now, I am working as Assistant Director for our upcoming Christmas play ('Tis The Season to Believe: A Bigfoot Christmas Special). There's a lot of work that goes into it, and I'm happy with the challenge.

6. What are your future plans with CLOTA?

This winter, I'm excited for Cheaper by the Dozen, my directorial debut. While I have directed for MCT and scenes in college, I have never directed a full-scale performance. I'm honored that after just a year of being involved, I get to take such a big step. My main goal with this show is to get more of the community interested in what we have to offer, especially the youth. Hopefully, we will have some new kids who find a talent and passion for the art, and they will keep coming back and bring friends.




THE CLOTA BRAG BOARD
